The 98th Cork Eucharistic Procession to mark the feast of Corpus Christi will take place on **Sunday May 26th**. The procession will leave the North Cathedral at 3pm and make its way through the city to Saints Peter and Paul where there will be a short liturgy and benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

Parish groups are encouraged to gather at the Cathedral and to process together under their parish banner. For those who may have mobility issues, you will be able to join the procession at the river side of the Opera House under a Eucharistic Banner. The Stewards will facilitate and direct this group to join the Procession.


PARISH REFLECTION PROGRAM.

The world is full of polite demons. The demons do not want us to become holy, it does not want us to bear witness to Christ, it does not want us to be a disciple of Christ. The evil spirit distracts us from the path of Christ. At first it is subtle: a little envy or resentment, a grievance in our hearts, a sense of hurt we nurse. As it takes root, it becomes stronger as we feed it and confirm it by spreading to others until, finally, "it seeks to justify itself".

The temptation of pride is to refuse self-transcendence, to imagine we are the source of our own light, in which we have no need of values outside of our self-interest or even any openness to reality.



The parish newsletter is also a powerful symbol of mission and outreach. By giving one to the sick, the housebound and those in nursing homes, we are keeping them connected to the faith community and reminding them that they have not been forgotten.



Whoever the Spirit is, and however we seek to describe the Spirit, the presence of God is always about strength, energy, power; change, transformation, radical undoing and turning around, restoration and the cessation of all harm, violence, injustice, lies and despair.

Can you recognise the working of the spirit in our parish, in the church or in society?

SECOND READING Galatians 5: 16 - 25 A reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Galatians

If you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since selfindulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you. When self-indulgence is at work the results are obvious: fornication, gross indecency and sexual irresponsibility; idolatry and sorcery; e, joy and forgiveness.

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temper and quarrels; disagreements, factions, envy; drunkenness, orgies and similar things. I warn you now, as I warned you before: those who behave like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. What the Spirit brings is very different: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. There can be no law against things like that, of course. You cannot belong to Christ Jesus unless you crucify all self-indulgent passions and desire.

Since the Spirit is our life, let us be directed by the Spirit.

GOSPEL John 15: 26-27; 16: 12 -15 A reading from the holy Gospel according to John. Jesus said to his disciples:

When the Advocate comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who issues from the Father, he will be my witness. And you too will be witnesses, because you have been with me from the outset.

I still have many things to say to you but they would be too much for you now. But when the Spirit of truth comes he will lead you to the complete truth, since he will not be speaking as from himself but will say only what he has learnt; and he will tell you of the things to come. He will glorify me, since all he tells you will be taken from what is mine.
