Jesus & His Jewish Family

When it comes to thinking about Jesus, it is easy to forget that Jesus was brought up as a pious law-abiding member of the Jewish race. The Jewish religion was his religion; his God was the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob; the psalms would have been his prayers; his religious education would have been the experience of his people in history we have in the Old Testament.

Jesus was not an alien from outer space but emerged from within the tradition of Judaism in first century Palestine. He did not grow up in the wilderness, but grew up within a family and within a particular neighbourhood.

ON Christmas day or (more usually) on the day after, St Stephen's Day, the custom was to tour the city churches in order to see the various cribs.


"On St. Stephen's Day you'd bring the children on a tour of all the churches in the city to see the cribs – I brought mine from top to bottom! They laugh now about it! We lived in the city centre at that time. The best one was in the Redemptorists – the figures were lifelike. They were lovely customs. There wasn't much more to do with the children that time."

"Noreen, who was the youngest of her family. Her father used to bring her to "every crib in the city" on Stephen's Day. She makes the point that in her family they didn't have a crib at home, but that "the crib was in the church". She and her family used to visit the churches on St. Stephen's Day: "you'd go into each church and you'd see lots of people all coming and going in and out, all to see the crib."

Update on Trócaire's Work in Gaza

For St Joseph's Wilton Parish—December 2024 The Raw Facts:

- The latest death toll (as of 12 December 2024) stands at 45,614 Palestinians of which 17,492 are children. 1,139 people from the Israeli population have lost their lives.
- 106,257 Palestinians have been injured and 11,000 are still missing, many remain under the rubble and demolished homes, schools and other buildings that once stood in Gaza.
- So far, 90% of the Gazan population has been displaced this is 1.9 million IDPs (internally-displaced people).
- Close to 100% of Gaza's population now live in poverty. 495,000 people are facing catastrophic levels of food insecurity.
- The education system has collapsed. All 625,000 school-aged children of Gaza have been out of school since October 7, 2023.
- Gaza's health system has been significantly compromised. 80% of the primary care centres are no longer functional. 19 hospitals out of 36 are out of service.
- Over 300 humanitarian workers have been killed in Gaza in the past year.
